We have produced a a selection of fun and enjoyable routes in The Trossachs which are particularly suited to an e-bike starting from NCN 7 in Drymen, Aberfoyle Kinlochard Callander and Strathyre.

Many of them take in some great coffee and cafe stops along the way, as well as popular attractions.



LOCH LOMOND GATEWAY

Drymen to Balmaha (11 miles, 18km Return)

Time: 1 1/2 hours with stops

Suitable for: e-bikes, mountain bikes, resilient hybrids

A short e-bike friendly route on quiet roads, gravel trails and shared use paths from NCN7 Loch and Glens (North) to the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park Visitor Centre at Balmaha on the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond.

Viewpoints, Stops and Attractions

Stunning views over Loch Lomond. National Park Visitor Centre, Tom Weir Statue and Oak Tree Inn, Balmaha. Range of Café's and pubs in Drymen.

LOCH KATRINE LOOP Aberfoyle to Trossachs Pier to Stronachlachar (31 miles, 50km)

Time: 4 hours with stops

Suitable for: e-bikes, road bikes, resilient hybrids

Iconic Trossachs adventure for everyone; on road, with family and all ability options taking in some fabulous scenery.

Viewpoints, Stops and Attractions

Loch Katrine Café, Stronachlachar Pier café, Loch Arklet with views over to The Arrochar Alps. Extension possible to Inversnaid Hotel and Loch Lomond.

DUCHRAY CASTLE LOOP Aberfoyle to Kinlochard (10 miles, 16km)

Time: 3 hours with stops

Suitable for: e-bikes, mountain bikes, resilient hybrids

Explore the historic Statute Labour Road and enjoy iconic views of sparkling lochs, wooded hills and rugged mountains, in the Queen Elizabeth Forest Park.

Viewpoints, Stops and Attractions

Duchray Castle, Kinlochard, with village hall, hotel and leisure club.

TROSSACHS EXPLORER Kinlochard to Stonachlachar (17 miles, 27km Return)

Time: 3 hours with stops

Suitable for: e-bikes, mountain-bikes, resilient hybrids

Delightful ride on the Statute Labour Road and good roads through spectacular and iconic scenery of the Trossachs. Enjoy some great picnic stops along the way.

Viewpoints, Stops and Attractions

Stronachlachar Pier Cafe, Forest Hills Hotel & Spa. with stunning views over Loch Chon, Glen Arklet and Loch Arklet

HEART OF THE TROSSACHS Callander to Loch Achray

(15 miles, 24km Return)

Time: 2-3 hours with stops

Suitable for: e-bikes, mountain bikes, resilient hybrids

Mostly on cycle paths and minor roads. Highlights include, cycling along the wooded shoreline of Loch Venachar. Some hills, but you are rewarded with superb loch and mountain views.

Viewpoints, Stops and Attractions

ROB ROY LOOP

Strathyre to Balquhidder

Suitable for: e-bikes, road bikes, resilient hybrids

An easy, family-friendly ride through Strathyre

Highland coo sculpture, part of BLISS Art Trail,

Stunning views along Loch Venachar towards, Ben Ledi, Achray Farm (Ice Cream), Trossachs Pier Café.


